Tell us about your qualification and academic Profile.

I received college education from Government College Sargodha presently known as the University of Sargodha. Then I completed MSc. Mathematics in 1989 in first division from the University of Punjab. In 1991, I joined the Department of Auditor General of Pakistan and completed the professional examinations in the field of Public Finance, and became an associate member of PIPFA in 1994. In 1997, I got enrolled Cost and Management Accountancy (CMA) programme offered by ICMAP and completed CMA in 2000. In 2001, I received a scholarship from the Ministry of Science and Technology and completed MBA in Information Technology from COMSATS in 2003 with a gold medal. In 2004, I won a scholarship for MS leading to Ph.D. programme from HEC and completed MS Finance in 2006 with a silver medal and Ph.D. in 2010 from Muhammad Ali Jinnah University Islamabad. I started my career in the public sector and later on joined academia in 2010. I am working at Capital University of Science and Technology (CUST) since 2010 and during this period, I have served in administrative positions like HoD and Dean. I have also supervised more than 200 MS/MPhil thesis and twenty Ph.D. scholars. I have also presented research papers in numerous academic/professional conferences in Pakistan, Turkey, and the USA and have published many research papers in reputed impact factor journals in the field of finance.

What is your favorite part about working in academia as a Dean?

The Dean of a faculty is responsible to provide overall academic leadership within the faculty and integrating faculty's interests into the strategic plan of the university. My focus is on advancing the quality of programmes offered at the faculty and elevating academic excellence across the university. As a dean, I give priority to four aspects of education: improving the quality of curricula and instruction, making it relevant to national and international requirements, and promoting quality of research, and ensuring the best learning environment. Therefore, curricula are regularly revised and new subjects and skills are added to the existing programmes like Business Analytics, Digital Marketing, Project Finance, Financial Analytics, Marketing, and HR analytics. The faculty development programme is



chalked out and necessary workshops are arranged internally and externally. To keep aligned with international standards and practices, faculty is encouraged to join online advanced courses. Student-centric academic policies are devised and implemented transparently. Regular research/skill-based workshops are arranged so that capacity of the graduates is enhanced to compete in the market. Finally, academic discipline is ensured.

What is your opinion about the quality standards in academic institutions in Pakistan?

Education is a provincial matter in Paki-

stan. Primary and secondary education fall in the domain of provincial governments. More than 20 million children are out of school which is the second highest after Nigeria which is an alarming situation. These children are our future and deserve better tomorrow. An allout effort is required from all concerned quarters.

The universities are part of tertiary education which is overseen by the HEC that assists in curriculum development, accreditation, and the financing of research and development. Pakistan produces about 445,000 university graduates per year. Many of these are weakly trained as there are issues like shortage of quality teachers, outdated curriculum, less relevance to market needs, and lack of commitment from stakeholders. For example, the business curricula were revised in 2012, and in the last 10 years, no up-dation is made at the national level. Many programmes are more knowledge-based and not application based. There is more focus and interest on memorization to qualify and pass exams so students lack professional skills as well as communication skills when they are graduated from such institutions. Moreover, many institutions do not provide skills that have a demand in the market so the employability of such students is again an issue. These students when do not get an opportunity in the market, they create a question mark about the whole system. At the same time availability of quality, and faculty is also the main issue. There are several applicants with local/foreign degrees but few have in-depth knowledge of their discipline. Many aspirant teachers do not realize that of all the hard jobs around, one of the hardest is being a good teacher. There is also a bright side to the picture; some institutions are working very efficiently. These institutions upgrade their programmes, and curricula regularly, impart technical and soft skills and develop confidence

in students to compete in the market. It is the need of the hour that every institution should focus on market-driven courses and improve the quality of courses and faculty. Recently, HEC has devised a new undergraduate policy which is a good initiative and addresses some issues like student grooming, soft-skill development, and entrepreneurial drive, but still, we have to do a lot. Especially, the concept of a practical learning lab is very good, I expect that it will help to bridge the gap between conventual education and market skill and improve the employability of the graduates. At the same time, students should also realize that there is no shortcut to success and in this era of technology. they have access to global resources so they should continuously equip themselves with the latest developments in their field.

What role does a dean play in the smooth running of the department?

Within the university, a dean is responsible for strategic planning and budgets; leading faculty through curricular evolution and programme development; hiring exceptional faculty, and fostering a climate of excellence and connectedness between the faculty, and other academic and non-academic units of the university.

The Dean provides an academic vision for the faculty and assist the Vice Chancellor in Academic Affairs. Deans have academic and managerial, responsibilities for a faculty. Deans ensure the quality of instruction, monitor academic integrity, confer degrees, and are responsible for admissions, and academic progress. They are responsible for the ethical conduct of research and for establishing and maintaining a culture of compliance and integrity among faculty, staff, and students. They provide direction for the education, training, and implementation of university policies and procedures.

Capital University of Science and Technology is a student-centric university. I, as a dean, always keep the students first and plan and propose a change in curriculum or educational practices when it is in the interest of students. I believe in an open-door policy and students can visit any time to discuss their issues. The smooth running of a faculty is possible through teamwork; it means connecting with the head of departments, programme managers and faculty, and staff. Moreover, compassion is essential to develop a good bond among team members and helps in gaining the trust of the faculty at large. I think I am lucky that I have a very competent management team. As dean, I work with the faculty, staff, and students to cultivate a climate of intellectual excitement and creative vitality to achieve a shared vision. Moreover, through consultation, efforts are made to encourage curricular and pedagogical innovation, facilitate and support diversity and ensure alignment with the university's vision.

Finally, as a dean, I participate in faculty recruitment, retention, and development as well as oversee the development of the programmes and curriculum. These efforts are accomplished within the framework of shared responsibility among faculty and management to realize mission-driven outcomes.

What necessary steps do you take to maintain the integrity and efficiency of the Management and Social Sciences Faculty?

At CUST, we believe in the principles of academic integrity because the goals of teaching, learning, and research can only be accomplished in environments in which ethical standards are upheld. We are committed to three fundamentals: honesty, trust, and fairness. Honesty is a prerequisite for the full realization of trust, and fairness. We have published academic policies that send a clear message that falsification of data, lying, cheating, fraud, theft and other dishonest behaviors are unacceptable. These policies are strictly followed and necessary actions are taken against the persons involved. Trust is developed by setting clear and consistent academic standards, that apply these standards fairly. Trust is promoted by faculty who set clear guidelines for assignments, projects, and evaluation of student work. Fair, accurate, and impartial evaluation plays an important role in educational processes, and fairness with respect to grading and assessment is essential to the establishment of trust. Consistent and just responses to dishonesty and integrity breaches help to establish an environment of fairness. Similarly, we promote ethical conduct in all aspects of the research process including conflicts of interest, data acquisition, management, sharing and ownership, publication practices, responsible authorship, and collaborative research and reporting. The departmental research ethics committee ensures that the standards are followed in letter and spirit.

What are your short-term and longterm goals?

Strategic planning is critical to the development and growth of every organization. The primary objective of a university is the holistic development of students so that they can gain expertise in their relevant fields. As a dean, my task is to devise and ensure successful execution of strategy and keep it align with the university's vision and mission. Therefore, the strategic planning at the Faculty of Management and Social Sciences revolves around various initiatives.

The survival and sustainability of any organization lie in its growth; the growth of the faculty is not only focused on attracting new and better-quality students for the existing programmes but also on designing and offering new programmes that can meet the changing requirement of the market. The Faculty of Management and Social Sciences is highly responsive to cope with the changes in a dynamic market. The faculty continuously evaluates and improves its existing programmes as well as offers new programmes too. The new programmes in pipeline include BS Business Analytics, MS Psychology. MS English, and MS Business Analytics

Research activities are valued by the students, faculty, and business community. The Faculty of Management and

Social Sciences has a good blend of academicians and professionals trained from well-reputed foreign and domestic universities. They bring insights and research skills into the classroom and provide quality business education. The impact factor of papers published in the current year is more than 130. The university encourages and rewards basic scholarly research.

An educational institution is known for the product that it produces; if students get recognition in the market and get success in their careers, it creates a good reputation for the faculty and the university. The prime aim of the faculty is to produce career-ready graduates who are competitive in the market and responsible in society. For this purpose, various steps are planned including improvement in the quality of curriculum and faculty, focus on enhancing student competencies through skill-based workshops, increasing student exposure to the market through business projects, and career counseling.

The faculty recognizes the importance of liaison between industry and academia. It is a critical pathway toward significant opportunities for experiential learning and job placement. The university provides a vibrant forum for industrial experts, regulators, faculty members, and policymakers to share their special insights and ideas. The faculty is aimed to engage with the corporate sector to enable the faculty to become an active partner in the area of collaborative research, executive education, and human resource development. Various arrangements have been made in collaboration with ICCI. RCCI. NIC. PSX. SECP, and PMI. Finally, the objective of the faculty is to transform lives for the benefit of the society. This is achieved through the creation and dissemination of knowledge that contributes to the well-being of the society. New courses in the domain of Corporate Social Responsibility, Managerial Ethics, Public Policy etc., have been introduced. It is aimed to instill a spirit of volunteerism in vouth to make them realize the importance of their role in the betterment of society and in eradicating social evils.

What tools/strategies do you use to stay organized?

Organizing your work is the foundation of success in every area of your life. In order to stay organized, we follow a structured approach in the Faculty of Management and Social Sciences. The first step is setting short-term and longterm goals. The five years strategic plan is prepared where year-wise targets are set. The Faculty of Management and Social Sciences prepared its first strategic plan in 2016 and the second in 2021 with a focus on improving the quality of education and research, employability, and sustainability. New programmes and courses and skill sets were identified by engaging stakeholders from the corporate sector. BS Accounting and Finance programme was offered in 2017, BS Psychology in 2018, and BS English in 2021. Now, MS Accounting and Finance is Scheduled in 2022, and MS Psychology in 2023. Similarly, many new courses like Business Analytics, Financial Analytics, digital marketing, Marketing, analytics, and HR Analytics, have been designed and introduced to prepare business graduates for the future. When specific targets are set with milestones and a timeline, these help to organize work into more manageable tasks. To make sure that we achieve our goals in time, we track our progress. This is done through periodical reviews. Another important tool is to create a to-do list every week which contains import tasks that we have to complete within a week. It helps maintain productivity throughout the week. I would like to add that it is key to focus on what is important. You cannot do all things individually so assign tasks to your team members keeping in view their expertise. Finally, for young graduates, I would like to add that organized people are not born organized, they have to cultivate healthy habits, which then help them to stay organized.

Why did you join the field of Electrical Engineering, and why did you become a researcher?

In my early days, I liked Physics and had a keen interest in it. I wanted to go for graduation and higher studies in Physics, but my father advised me to go for something that was more relevant to the current job market and also relevant to Physics, so as Electrical Engineering was a branch closest to Physics and was the current need of the hour, it made me peruse it.

Well, regarding research when I started my carrier in Pakistan, I did not start from the academics. I was initially in a government organization and then moved to another American design house working in Islamabad. After spending five to six years there, I realized that there is a dire need for good Electrical Engineering researchers in Pakistan. I thought it would be better if I put my energy and focus to carryout quality research either in defense or industry. That is how I ended up focusing on research, trying to excel it.

What made you go above and beyond to demonstrate yourself as the best researcher in academia, and why was it important?

Well, you need to have some basic IQ, and a few other basic things to go beyond normal or average. First, your internal motivation and passion drive you to do something. When you have passion for something, working becomes very clear when you have belief in it and you know that this is something you can do, pursue and excel in. So, my passion and dedication for research is the reason behind my success.

The second thing is perseverance because whenever we chase something we always face many hurdles. Whenever you focus on something that has never been done before, you face a lot of problems as most of the time you do not have a mentor to face those hurdles so you need to persevere. So, I will answer this question in two words: motivation and drive.

How do you manage your research work with other major administrative responsibilities as a faculty member at CUST?

First of all, I have made strict timetables and made proper schedule for my meetings and other work. Basically, whatever I schedule for the first two hours of my day I give it my total attention and dedi-



cation so I prefer to put the most important tasks at the start of my schedule. These tasks are mostly to be performed in an organized way. The first two hours in the morning are my precious hours and I reserve them. I prioritize my time and work. I try to arrange my meetings in the afternoon because by then I am already done with my important works of the morning. I make weekly schedule having most important tasks for Mondays and Tuesdays and then less important ones for the end of the week. Also, I try to keep one day reserved for some external visits to conduct viva, some Ph.D. exam, or some seminars in some other institute. Moreover, I try to keep my meeting hours restricted to one-hour as that is a time limit a person can truly concentrate with a fresh mind. I believe that after one hour it becomes a waste of time, and this is a golden rule that I learnt from my professors in Hongkong. Thus, I will also say that it is not only you who manages things but you also have to teach your colleagues and students to manage time and get there on the appointed time. I also use google calendar frequently and also suggest others to write every detail on the calendar and manage their meeting time and other activities on it.

Can you explain a little bit about the research you are currently doing?

Most of us have cars and we all must know how they work. The engine needs petrol, you fill it with petrol and it gets burnt and some source boosts the car. Now if you look at the technology of engine thirty years ago, it was all based on mechanical work. There was no electronics involved but in the current cars, there are about forty computer chips installed in a car. Now this means that our engines are now controlled by these computer chips. So, because my main area of research is Computer Programming, therefore I focus on different kinds of programmes/chips that goes into the car computers. Twenty years ago, electronic cars came which were known as the EFI cars, and now every car is an EFI car. So, my group works on the computers of those cars which studies how should they be programmed, do they work smoothly, what are the challenges and what are the faults, and how to run a car so that minimum petrol is consumed. We have also started working on the treatments for cancer with Electrical Engineering in collaboration with the Biosciences department.

What would you suggest to the emerging researchers to improve their research skills, and why it is

so important to boost their career in academia as well as in industry?

I would suggest them to read a lot to improve their research skills because that is the only way through which we can learn and explore more and more. Looking at the next part of the question, I would say that when you talk about the industry, here comes action while in academia teachers' main focus is on theory. Unfortunately, most of our academia does not focus on doing things practically, but if you go to industry, it becomes essential to apply what you learn. Working with industry makes you understand more about your work. I would suggest that practical implementation of any theory in the industry is also very important way to understand your field which would ultimately boost the career as a student and as a professional.

To improve the quality of higher education and to move university education to meet international standards in the provision of high-quality teaching, learning, research and service, HEC established Quality Enhancement Cells (QECs) in HEIs as a special feature of QA programme of Pakistan higher education system. QEC is mandated to ensure academic improvements, faculty development, and student-centered outcomes. QEC is responsible to develop, implement and monitor IQA and EQA policies in the HEIs under the guidelines of QAA, and act as focal point between the institution, HEC, and other regulatory bodies. QEC has to maintain and develop university quality assurance processes and methods of evaluation to affirm that the quality of provisions and the standard of awards are being maintained. QEC usually conducts academic audits to ascertain the standards and quality of teaching, learning and management in each subject area through various surveys as well as alumni and employee feedbacks. The quality assessment results, received through the survey instruments, help review the structure of existing programmes being offered by the university. It also provides guidance to the respective departments to streamline their programme objectives in line with the vision and mission of the university.
