# **BS** in Accounting and Finance

The BS Accounting and Finance is highly specialized program designed to prepare students to meet the challenges emerging in complex domain of financial reporting and management. The program is tailored to first impart a broad-based education in the fundamentals of business and management and then develop the quantitative and analytical skills necessary to become prudent, astute and ethical financial managers.

### **■** Program Educational Objectives (PEOs)

PEOs describe the expected accomplishments of the BS-A&F graduates during the first few years after completing their program. Department of Accounting and Finance intends to achieve the following educational objectives:

- (i) The graduates will demonstrate functional knowledge of Accounting and Finance.
- (ii) The graduates will exhibit the ability to perform managerial tasks at operational and strategic level in specialized organizations.
- (iii) The graduates will execute and willingness to ethical values and diversity.

#### **■** Program Learning Outcomes (PLOs)

After successful completion of the BS-A&F program, the graduates will posses the following attributes:

(i) Cross functional Knowledge: An ability to use knowledge of the fundamentals of accounting, mathematics, economics, management, marketing, and finance to solve business problems.

- (ii) **Problem Analysis:** An ability to identify, formulate and analyze complex accounting and business problems reaching substantiated conclusions using case studies.
- (iii) Management Skills: An ability to demonstrate management skills while leading/managing business projects.
- (iv) Business Solution: An ability to design solutions for complex business problems or processes that meet specified needs while maintaining business standards, legal, cultural, societal, and environmental considerations
- (v) Communication: An ability to communicate effectively, verbally as well as in writing, in corporate settings.
- (vi) **Entrepreneurial Skills:** Ability to exhibit entrepreneurial skills through the integration of technology in accounting and finance.
- (vii) Individual and Team Work: An ability to work effectively, as an individual as well as team setting.
- (viii) Modern Tool Usage: An ability to identify and apply accounting and finance tools and techniques to create and disseminate business information.
- (ix) Corporate Social Responsibility: An ability to understand the responsibility of an organization towards the society at large and to contribute towards the betterment of society.
- (x) Ethics: Apply ability to professionally apply ethical principles, keeping in view the norms of society.

- (ii) CUST Admission Test/HEC Approved Test.

### ■ Business Project (6 Cr. Hrs.)

Every student must complete a Business Project following the  $6^{th}$  semester or after the completion of 90 credit hours of course work.

### **■** Internship (AF4000)

Each student is required to complete 9 weeks internship training usually after  $6^{th}$  semester or on completion of 90 Cr. Hrs. The internship shall be graded as pass/fail.

#### **■** Community Service

Each student is required to complete 65 hours community work, usually after 4<sup>th</sup> semester which would be a prerequisite for the award of degree.

### **■** Program Duration

This is a four-year degree program comprising of 8 semesters. There will be a Fall and a Spring semester each year. The summer semester will be utilized for Business Projects or deficiency courses. The maximum duration to complete the BS Accounting & Finance is 7 years.

#### **■ CGPA** Requirement

A student is required to earn a minimum 2.00/4.00 CGPA on the completion of degree requirements.
