The department is planning to offer MS English Literature and PhD English Linguistics and Literature. Also, we are planning to launch an ELT journal, and establish an English Language Centre.

- (viii) **Use of educational technology:** An ability to select and apply appropriate techniques, resources, and modern tools in learning and teaching.
- (ix) **Management skills:** An ability to demonstrate management skills at personal and institutional level in academic/professional settings.
- (x) **Team work:** An ability to work effectively, as an individual or in a team, on multifaceted and /or multidisciplinary settings.
- (xi) **Ethics:** Apply ethical principles and commit to professional ethics and responsibilities and norms of research and/or teaching practices.
