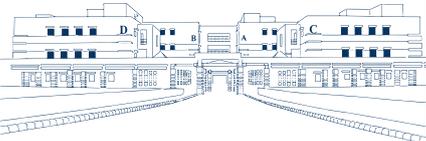

SCHOLARSHIP POLICY

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CUST Scholarship Policy

1. Introduction

At Capital University of Science and Technology (CUST), we believe that financial constraints must never stand in the way of ambition, talent, and the pursuit of knowledge. Each year, we extend millions of rupees in the form of diverse scholarships and financial assistance, reflecting our strong commitment to educational equity, inclusivity, and empowerment. In line with our mission to foster academic excellence and our core values of integrity, compassion, and opportunity, this policy has been established to ensure that no deserving student is left behind due to economic hardship.

2. Types of Scholarships

The Scholarship Policy covers all types of scholarships and financial assistance offered to support academically capable and deserving students from all walks of life. CUST offers a broad spectrum of scholarships and aid programs, including Merit-Based Scholarships for high achievers, Need-Based Financial Assistance for students facing economic challenges, Sports Scholarships to reward exceptional co-curricular performance, and Special Category Scholarships for orphans and differently abled individuals.

Through this comprehensive and inclusive approach, CUST strives to unlock the full potential of its student community and contribute meaningfully to national development.

In addition to student support, CUST also places high value on the professional growth of its academic community. Therefore, the university has introduced Faculty Development Scholarships to encourage and support full-time faculty members in pursuing advanced degrees and specialized training programs. This initiative is aligned with CUST’s strategic goal of building a vibrant, research-driven academic environment and fostering lifelong learning among its educators. These Scholarships are subject to the conditions mentioned in Section (3).

2.1 Merit Scholarship for Undergraduate Programs

Note: Any student acquiring the continuation CGPA shall be eligible for the corresponding scholarship even if not awarded at the time of admission except 100% Merit Scholarship.

Note: Any Graduate student achieving the continuation CGPA shall be eligible for the corresponding scholarship even if not awarded at the time of admission.

3. General Conditions

The following conditions shall apply:

- (a) For undergraduate Scholarships, the required CGPA must be earned with a minimum load of twelve (12) credit hours.
- (b) For Graduate Scholarship, the required CGPA should be attained with a minimum load of six (6) credit hours.
- (c) Scholarships shall be awarded in the form of tuition fee waiver, only. They shall not be applicable to admission fee or any other charges of the University, unless specifically stated otherwise.
- (d) No Scholarship shall be applicable on Thesis/Project or summer registration.
- (e) The Scholarship shall be awarded only within normal degree duration and shall not be applicable to any extra semester(s) for whatsoever reasons.
- (f) A specially-abled student if not meeting the CGPA eligibility criterion, shall be awarded 25% reduced scholarship if the CGPA is below the required CGPA but higher than the CGPA required for the award of degree.

- (g) In Merit Scholarship, the students shall be awarded percentage which corresponds to their CGPA as defined in Section (2.1).
- (h) Merit Scholarship for new admissions shall be awarded on the basis of the available result, in case the applicant is result awaiting.
- (i) Applicants admitted in 5th semester after 14-year /ADP qualification shall be considered for scholarships by comparing their CGPA with the continuation CGPA of the corresponding category.
- (j) The University, vide its discretionary power, has the authority to change the definition or percentage of any Scholarship, with the approval of the Academic Council, and it shall be binding on all awardees.
- (k) No Scholarship shall be applicable to a repeat course or to any course registered for improvement.
- (l) Any student found guilty by the Discipline Committee shall be ineligible for any scholarship.

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
